ACADEMICS

We at Bal Bharati realize the importance of Education in shaping not only an individual's life but also a nation's destiny. Agreeing with Joseph Adison's view "*what sculpture is to a block of marble, education is to human soul*," we firmly believe that academic excellence is the touchstone of any educational institution. The brilliant performance of our students, I feel proud to announce, has added yet again, to our resplendent glory.

In the class X Board Examinations conducted by Central Board of Secondary Education in 2010, 312 students appeared. The pass percentage was a remarkable 100%. Eighty two students scored a CGPA greater than 9 while 612 A1 & A2 grades were scored. A perfect score of CGPA, 10, was scored by 6 of our students, namely Aditi Bansal, Anirudh Kumar Parag, Arushi Jain, Pragya Chawla, Neha Gosain and Himanshu Seth.

In the Class XII, AISSC Examination 2010, conducted by the Central Board of Secondary Education, 270 students appeared. Ninety percent of the students passed

with first division and 775 distinctions were scored. Meeta Aggarwal topped the Science Stream with an enviable score of 96.2%. Divij Anand with an impressive 95.4% was the topper of the Commerce stream while in Humanities, Vasuli Chadha scored the maximum, that is 79.6%.

WORKSHOP FOR SCIENCE TEACHERS OF CLASS IX AND X

The school hosted a Workshop for Science Teachers of Class IX and X on behalf of National Progressive Schools' Conference on September 4. It was attended by more than 90 teachers from almost 50 schools of Delhi as well as outside the capital.

The workshop was conducted in three sessions by eminent resource persons, closely associated with the CBSE and the Science CCE Curriculum. These were Ms Rita Talwar, former Principal, Cambridge School, Srinivaspuri, Dr N P Dhaka, Principal, Dr Rajendra Prasad Vidyalaya, President's Estate and Mr Suraj Prakash, former Principal, CRPF Public School, Rohini.

The first of the three sessions focused on Teaching of Integrated Science, followed by a session on Laboratory Activities for Formative Assessment. In the third session, Formative Assessment Activities in Science, consisted of a Presentation by Ms Geeta Gangwani, Vice Principal of the school. Doubts and queries of the teachers related to formative assessment and CCE in general, were addressed by Mr L V Sehgal, Principal and the resource persons.

Another Workshop for Science Teachers of class IX and X, on behalf of NPSC was held on November 27.

It was attended by 70 teachers from 41 schools of Delhi and NCR. The workshop was conducted in two sessions by eminent resource persons. The focus of the workshop was to demonstrate science activities for formative assessment using Microkits developed by NCERT under the guidance of Professor H C Gupta.

In the first session, a demonstration for the use of Microkits was given. This was followed by lab activities where the teachers got hands-on experience in using the kits. The second session consisted of a Presentation on formative assessment activities. The participants then worked in groups to formulate formative assessment activities. Each group leader presented one activity, its objective, execution, evaluation and remediation in detail.

WORKSHOP ON DEBATING SKILLS

On 4th December, a workshop on Debating Skills was organized for students in collaboration with WORDZ- the Delhi chapter. WORDZ is a students' organization based in Chandigarh, which works to enhance public speaking and leadership skills among students.

The interactive workshop was conducted by Mr. Simarjeet Singh, a Motivational Speaker and Leadership Trainer of international repute. The inspiring workshop infused the participants with a can-do approach to face the challenges of life.

SPIC MACAY

Under the aegis of SPIC MACAY, a five day workshop, 'The National School Intensive Program 2010' was organized by Delhi Public School, Patna from 25 to 30 December, 2010. The main aim of this programme was to familiarize students with our ancient Guru- Shishya tradition. A five member team from our school, consisting of Aditya Roy (IX), Mridul Jain (VII), Gandharv Choudhary (VIII) and Pranshu

Sharma (VI) led by Mr Suman Jha, Assistant Teacher Music, attended this innovative workshop.

In the Welcome Ceremony, the students witnessed the performances of renowned artistes, such as Begum Parween Sultana (Vocal), Pt. L Subramaniam (Violin) and Pt. Birju Maharaj (Kathak) etc. As a part of the Guru- Shishya parampara, the students had to follow a daily routine of waking up at 3.30 am followed by Yoga and 'Shramdaan'. Further, they were put in different groups headed by exponents of different art forms. While Pranshu attended intensive Kathak classes by Pt. Birju Maharaj and Smt. Saswati Sen, the other three students received lessons in Indian Classical Music by Guru Nandini Bedekar. The afternoon sessions consisted of talks, movies and programmes showcasing rare art forms. An inspiring talk by the famed environmentalist, Sh Sunderlal Bahuguna left a deep impact on the students. On the last day, students put up performances displaying what they had learnt during the workshop. This unique workshop proved to be a memorable and enriching experience.

CLUBS

"I hear and I forget. I see and I remember. I do and I understand" is ancient Chinese proverb, which bears great significance in the learning process. The school has a number of clubs, each initiated to fulfill numerous secondary objectives, but with a common primary objective which is to bring education closer to life and enable students to "learn by doing."

ASTRONOMY CLUB

The Astronomy Club, that came into being in 2004, has played an important role in developing a scientific temper among students. It continues to guide students in unraveling the mysteries of the universe through activities, such as follows:-

- An Evening Session of the club for Module I and Module II was organized. The students of Module I learnt the need and use of different types of telescopes. Module II students learnt the technique of taking pictures of

celestial objects such as moon etc. using telescopes & SLR camera. A Lunar and planetary watch, through telescope was organized for students and parents.

- A workshop was conducted by SPACE for students and teachers on ISS Earth KAM Project. Earth KAM is a NASA sponsored, global education programme that enables students to photograph and examine Earth from the perspective of SPACE. Students were trained to take photographs of the earth's features using a window of the International SPACE Station.
- Astronomy Club organized two sessions for the students of Module I. In the session, 'Journey on a Beam of Light', information about sun, moon, planets, meteors, asteroids and comets etc. was imparted. The second session 'Directions' focused on the concept of 'Angle of Azimuth'.
- A night session for the club members at Jewar (UP) was organized.
- A session each on 'Time and SPACE', 'Weather and Climate', 'Solar Walk' and 'Earth, Sun, Moon' was conducted.
- Astronomy Club Asteroid Search Campaign

Under the aegis of SPACE, Astronomy Club members of our School participated in "International Asteroid Search Campaign for Asteroid" between 17 May 2010 and 30 June 2010. So far, 11 countries of 4 continents have participated in it. It involved using software to sift through data files provided by IASC, and to spot moving objects. The photographed images of the sky were also provided by Astronomical Research Institute (ARI) Observatory located at Charleston, USA. The students analyzed these images and confirmed one NEO (near earth object) and made seven observations of main belt asteroid. The students worked parallel with professional astronomers and got a taste of the actual research being done in the field of astronomy.

Felicitation ceremony for the event was held at the American Centre, New Delhi.

COMMERCE CLUB

The Commerce Club was started in 2009 with the objective to encourage students to analyze the changes taking place in the business environment around them as well as enhance the theoretical and practical knowledge of the subject. The activities undertaken by the club were:

- The Triumphant Institute of Management Education Pvt. Ltd., Delhi organized a Commerce Quiz for students of class XI and XII. Three out of fifteen participating teams qualified for the final round, which was held at St. Columba's School. The competition helped to enhance the students' knowledge about the current scenario in Business & Economy.
- The Commerce Olympiad was organized by Commerce Teachers' Association. 40 students from Class XI and XII sat for the exam. The excellent performance of the students helped the school win 34th rank among the 156 participating schools of Delhi and NCR.

DRAMATICS CLUB

The pressing need for a Dramatics Club met with fruition when the club was officially announced in 2009. The objective was to tap nascent talent and fine tune the existing potential among students. The response has been spontaneous and overwhelming among all age groups of students.

The Dramatics Club showcased an English One Act –Play "The Happy Man" by H.Adams. Eighty eight of our budding actors performed in this light morality play. It focused on the reflective side of life and happiness, through the central character of the unhappy king, engaged in the search of happiness. The performance also included a rich variety of songs and dances that effectively conveyed the message that true happiness lies in simplicity and leading a useful life. The distinguished presence of Sh K K Khullar, President, Child Education Society and Chairman of the school at the show was a great source of inspiration and encouragement. The club organized four repeat performances for the students of the Primary, Middle, Secondary and Senior Secondary classes.

ECONOMICS CLUB

The students of the Economics Club prepared and maintained a display board on 'CENSUS OF INDIA' during the session, to create awareness, as 2011 is the year of Census of India. They also participated in various Inter-School activities like Economics Symposium, simulation of conference of Chief Ministers of India on GST, Speech cum presentation on Women Reservation Bill, Economic Aspect etc.

In the school, the Club organized ADVIT, an Inter-house Competition focusing on the importance of advertisements in marketing of different products. Participants of each house prepared witty advertisements to promote unsaleable products, such as house without windows, time machine etc.

The Economics Club is thus continuously making efforts to realize its objectives of sensitizing students to global economic changes. It is also providing opportunities to them to express their views on happenings in the field of economics and business.

ENVIRONMENT CLUB

Launched officially in 2001 in collaboration with Delhi Government, the Eco-Club has been a cauldron of environment related activities aimed at sensitizing the students to the immediate need of protecting and preserving our precious environment.

- Eco – club organized a 'Fabric Painting Competition'. The creatively designed handkerchiefs bearing environment related messages were prepared by the club members.
- A special morning assembly to commemorate the Earth Day was organized. A pledge was taken by the entire school to express their commitment towards protecting Earth. Eco club members along with Ms Malini Dhall participated in the Earth Day celebrations organised at BBPS, Pitam Pura.
- A movie on 'Global Warming', its causes, effects and prevention methods, was screened for students of Class IX. This was followed by a PowerPoint presentation, by Dhruv Avdhesh of Class IX G on 'The Most Severely Damaged Ecosystems' along the river Ganga.

- A skit on 'Environmental Issues' was presented by the students at India Habitat Centre, Lodi Road.
- Thirty five students of Middle Department attended the prize distribution ceremony of "Akshay Urja Divas" at Siri Fort Auditorium.
- A trip to the Aravali Bio Diversity Park was organized for class X students.
- The school participated in '**Green School Programme**', a self assessment programme under guidelines specified by Centre for Science and Environment and supported by Government of NCT of Delhi, Directorate of Education and Department of Environment. The aim was to make students environmentally aware and active.

The school had applied in the category of Best Manager in the field of energy, for which an energy audit was conducted in the school which included analyzing the sources of energy, consumption of energy and devising ways in which the resources can be saved to minimize pollution and cost.

Our school was amongst the top fifteen schools short-listed for Delhi State Green Schools Award 2010.

HERITAGE CLUB

The Heritage Club was initiated in the year 2010 for the students of Middle Department with the purpose of creating awareness, preserving and promoting our varied and rich ancient culture and traditions, among the young learners.

- An interactive session was held in which the club members were familiarized with the purpose and objective of the club. This was followed by a Slogan Writing Competition focusing on the rich cultural heritage of our country.
- Trips to neighborhood religious places i.e. Gurudwara Phula Singh (Singh Sabha), Pusa Road and Shiv Mandir, GRH Marg were organised for classes VI & VII.
- A presentation on the origin and celebration of Christmas was shown to the members of Heritage Club. The members also prepared presentations on the festival and Christmas carols were sung.
- A presentation on Republic Day was organized for classes VI-VIII. The Republic Day Parade of 2010 was shown and the significance of the day was highlighted.

A live demonstration of Presidents' speech was also enacted. Collages and national flags were made by a group of students from each class.

- A free hand drawing competition was held on the eve of Basant Panchmi. The students depicted the festival in a myriad of colours on their drawing sheets.
- A Heritage Tour to Qutub Minar for class VI-VIII was organized.

INTERACT CLUB

Interact club of the school has been consistently trying to make students useful and responsible members of the society, by encouraging them to do their bit for the society.

- A group of 30 students went to India Gate to participate in the documentation of the "Pledge Campaign" under the aegis of Rotary Club of Delhi Mid Town. Two students got the opportunity to meet Ms Pratibha Patil, President of India with Rotary Club dignitaries to present the Pledge on "Save Water, Save Life".
- Members of Interact Club collected around 500 old books of all genres from the students and staff. These books were handed over to the General Secretary, Confederation of UNESCO Clubs and Association of India (CUCAI) during the last week of October.
- The members initiated 'Anti Cracker Campaign- 2010'. The message, 'Say NO to Crackers' was conveyed to the students by going to different classrooms before Diwali.
- Old clothes in good condition and books from the students and staff members were collected by the club members. The clothes were donated to 'Goonj', an NGO working for the orphans, while books were donated to the organization, 'AVIVA'.
- Members of Interact Club addressed the students about the need for vegetarianism in the present world and requested the students and staff members to take pledge not to eat meat on 25 November 2010 which is observed as 'Meatless Day and Animals Rights Day'. They also got the pledge forms signed by their near and dear ones.

- In the drive, 'Donation for Charity' the members collected donations from students and staff members.
- The school has enrolled in Delhi School's Literacy Programme (DSLPP) which is under State Resource Centre (SRC). Under the 'Each One Teach One' project, students of Middle and Secondary Departments will be teaching illiterate adults on one to one basis with the help of primers.
- Members of the Interact Club had put up a stall in Winter Carnival to showcase the work done by the members throughout the session. Denim clothes collected by students were donated to Denim Club of India, an NGO working for the welfare of workers in Denim Mills. An 'On the Spot Painting Competition' on HIV and AIDS was also organised for the students. Prizes and certificates were awarded to the three best entries in each category.
- Students as Active Citizens (SAC)
Students as Active Citizens (SAC) is Swechha's short-term outreach programme with Schools and other educational institutions eager to engage themselves with issues of Environment, Life Skills and Citizenship. The programme aims to enable students to ideate on Action Projects and find ways of addressing Social and Environmental crises around them. Our school is one among the three schools in Delhi chosen by Swechha for this innovative programme. In the introductory session, a brief orientation about the vision of the SAC program was given to the students. '**Jijivisha**' a film made by Vimlendu Jha was screened for the club members. The film traces the story of the River Yamuna from its origin till its confluence with River Ganga at Allahabad. This was followed by an interactive session with students. To sensitize students to the fact that the River, an ancient natural resource, is being destroyed owing to human activities, the students were also taken for a Yamuna Walk.

LITERARY CLUB

The Literary Club, formerly known as the Book Club was initiated in the year, 2008 with the primary objective of inculcating a love of reading among students. Over these years, the club has expanded, both, in terms of the number of members as

well as the wide array of activities that are organized regularly. Following activities were undertaken during the academic session 2010-11.

- The Literary Club of Senior Department organized an Interactive Session with Mr. Manas Ranjan Mahapatra, a poet, translator and Senior Editor of The National Centre for Children's Literature (NCCL), a wing of National Book Trust (NBT) to commemorate the World Book Day on 23 April. Mr. Mahapatra addressed the students regarding the innumerable benefits of adopting a sound reading habit. Later the winners of 'Book Jacket Designing Competition' were honoured with books and certificates by him.
- A three-day long Scholastic Book Fair was organised in May to initiate the Literary Club activities for the students of Primary and Middle Department. The main aim being to encourage reading habits in the young learners.
- A Quiz based on "Ramayana" was organized for students of Class IV and V. Eight teams participated in the quiz. Eight interesting rounds of questions were conducted by the students of the Middle Department. At the end, there was a puppet show based on "Ramayana" put up by the students of the Primary Department.
- The Literary Club members of the Middle Department organized a Quiz to celebrate the 150th birth anniversary of Shri Rabindranath Tagore. The quiz covered the life and works of Rabindranath Tagore. A PowerPoint presentation on the same was shown to the students.
- A Cartoon Making Competition was organized for students of the Literary Club of Primary & Middle Department on the theme "Funny Sporting Events at Commonwealth Games". The famous cartoonist, Mr Ajit Narayan, firstly, in an interactive session gave useful tips to make cartoons and later judged the entries of the participants. Thirty best entries were given a Certificate of Appreciation each, and the top five entries received books autographed by Mr Ajit Narayan.
- The Club conducted a Book Discussion. Students from Primary Department discussed the story 'The Blue Umbrella' and members from Middle Department

discussed 'Chachi's Funeral' by the famous author Ruskin Bond. Best speakers were awarded prizes. The story was also enacted by the students.

- A Debating workshop for the club members, Senior Department, was conducted by Wordz-Delhi. Wordz is an organization based in Chandigarh that works in association with college students to make the art of debating widespread.
- A Card Making Competition was organized for the students of Primary & Middle Deptt. Thoughtful New Year resolutions inscribed in these attractive and colourful cards by the students added yet another perspective to this interesting activity.
- The Club organized an activity based on the life of renowned scholar and poet, Maulana Abul Kalam Azad. The students of the Primary Department made a poster of Maulana Abul Kalam Azad and an English Calligraphy Competition based on a selected passage of his biography was also organized. The students of the Middle Department prepared a PowerPoint presentation based on the life and works of this luminous personality.
- An interactive session with the renowned new-age author Amitabha Bagchi was organized for the club members of Senior Department. Bagchi's novel 'Above Average' was published by Harper Collins in 2007. Mr. Bagchi read passages to the students from the books that influenced him and contributed to his growth as a writer. After the session, the students got copies of the novel autographed by the author.
- The club members of the Senior department visited the 16th Delhi Book Fair. They got an opportunity to recommend and select books for the library.
- A Book Reading Session was organized for members of the Senior department. They read out extracts from their favourite books. In yet another such session, the members discussed and read aloud from Jhumpa Lahiri's Pulitzer Prize winning collection of short stories, 'Interpreter of Maladies'.

ROBOTICS CLUB

The school in collaboration with 'A-SET Training & Research Institute' launched the 'Robotic Club'. The main objective of the Club is to build a strong base in physics,

computer programming and artificial intelligence among the students. The Club activities aim to train the members in different Robotic platforms.

A two hour session for the members, was held on every first and third Saturday of the month. The club members were taught higher electronics covering analogue and digital electronics. They were also given practical demonstrations using real humanoid robots. In addition, they also prepared projects like audio amplifier and multi-vibrator.

NIE PROGRAMME

Harold J. Laski opined, "A people without reliable news is sooner or later a people without the basis of freedom." The NIE Programme of the school is aimed at empowering the young learners to be well informed and discerning world citizens of the future.

The school has been a regular member of the PACE Programme of The Hindustan Times, the Newspaper in the Education Programme of the Times of India as well as The Hindu. In addition, we also regularly subscribe to The Statesman.

Under these programmes, besides getting the customized editions of the newspapers, a plethora of activities are also organized that encourage creativity, make learning fun and thereby render the Newspapers to be unique tool that holistically aids the process of education. Some of these activities are enlightening seminars, interactive workshops, talent hunting contests, result-oriented competitions and enjoyable movie fests etc.

This year too, our students participated in the Quiz Competitions organized by the Times of India and Colouring Competition organized by The Hindu. The literary & creative abilities of our students found expression through their articles printed in these newspapers.

Smita Pathak of class IX was selected by NIE (TOI) Editorial Team to attend a Summer Training Camp that was held at the Times of India office, BSZ Marg. It gave

her the unique hands on experience to work in the Editorial Department and learn the intricacies involved.

In addition, the school also participated in 'Go India, Go for Gold' an exciting and innovative Cheering Activity organized on the occasion of the Commonwealth Games by HT-PACE.

The NIE Programme of the school, thus is constantly evolving and helps to bridge the gap between the classroom learning and the outside world.

A rich mosaic of activities / events, with an international perspective are organized regularly to enable them to develop an understanding of the people, culture and traditions of the world. We aim to equip our learners such that they are able to face the challenges posed by the rapidly changing "eduscape" over the world and not only carve a niche for themselves but be the instruments of positive change in this world, which owing to human activities, is constantly in a state of flux, every day, every moment...

UKIERI ACTIVITIES

UK-India Education & Research Initiative (UKIERI) is a collaborative programme aimed at improving educational links between India and the UK. It was launched by Mr. Tony Blair, the former British Prime Minister in 2006, in India. The three main strands of the initiative are Higher Education & Research; Schools; and Professional and Technical Skills.

The UKIERI Schools strand is a three-year programme, which aims to facilitate the growth of cluster schools partnerships to increase the levels of engagement between UK and Indian Schools. It provides a unique platform for the sharing of educational development and reform in School sectors in the UK and India.

Under the aegis of UKIERI, the various activities that were organized this year are as follows:-

- *Bringing India to the UK and the UK to India* was the activity in which students of Class 3 were engaged actively throughout the year. Under this activity, students were made aware of the traditions, beliefs, customs, various dance, music & art forms of the UK.
- The students witnessed four special *Morning Assemblies* based on traditions and customs of UK in the month of July.
- An *Art Competition* was organized on 13 July. The topic of this event was to draw a scene based on any story from the life of Lord Jesus and Mother Mary.
- An *Art Workshop* was conducted to expose our young talented artists to the famous Art forms of UK. Art works of famous artists like Andy Warhol etc. were chosen. Students thoroughly enjoyed the hands on experience in making Pen Portraits. Their work was displayed in the Annual Exhibition held on 13 August.
- A special *Music and Dance Programme* displaying songs and dances of UK was held on 20 August in the School Auditorium. The students presented traditional songs of the UK such as Punky Nights, Joy to the World etc. It was followed by the Garland Dance, Morris Dance and Halloween Dance. The colourful costumes and well-synchronized movements made this event a memorable one.
- The Middle Department also organized an Inter-House PowerPoint Presentation and Graffiti Making Competition- a UKIERI Project on 8 September. Eighty students participated in the programme. The participants of each of the eight houses prepared impressive PowerPoint presentations in addition to thought-provoking and creative graffiti on the topic allocated to them. The topics included social issues related to India & UK, such as child labour in India, Problems of Adolescents in UK, Corruption in India, School Indiscipline in UK,

etc. The contest gave the participants an opportunity to explore the issues related to both the countries in a broader perspective.

ISA ACTIVITIES

The British Council International School Award (ISA) is an accreditation scheme for international curriculum work in schools. The scheme was piloted by British Council India with an aim to recognize the international work in schools including partnerships with schools in the UK. ISA offers a structured approach to international work and involves 3 main stages- formulation of an action plan, implementation of the approved plan and compilation of a dossier of evidence to be assessed by a panel of experts. The award consists of a certificate and the use of the ISA logo for a period of 3 years.

We undertook ISA during the 2007-2008 session and received the award in 2008.

- The Primary department organized the following special *Morning Assemblies*, as part of the ISA programme.
 - ✓ A special assembly was organized on April 16 to observe the *World Health Day* which is celebrated on April 7 worldwide. The programme, consisting of enlightening talks, interesting stories and skits highlighted the significance of physical and mental fitness in addition to maintaining personal hygiene and clean surroundings. Importance of good health in an individual's life and its implications for the society as a whole, were emphasized.
 - ✓ *International Peace Day* was celebrated on September 24. The inspiring programme highlighted the contributions of spiritual leaders to the world peace. Through a rich variety of musical items, the need for maintaining universal peace was stressed upon. Lastly, the students pledged to promote and maintain universal peace.
 - ✓ *World Children's Day* is observed on November 20, annually. In the morning assembly programme, on November 6, the significance of the day was highlighted. In addition, a medley of impressive and entertaining

items including poems, songs and instrumental music were put up on the occasion.

- ✓ On 10th December, *Human Rights Day* was celebrated. The role of UN in promoting and protecting human rights was emphasized. A short play, in addition to the vibrant cultural programme sensitized and encouraged students towards the need for respecting human dignity.
- The Sr Sec and Sec Department organized an *Inter-House Cartoon-making Competition, 'Toonmania'* on 7 May.

The four members of each of the eight participating teams selected their cartoon characters from the West or the Oriental countries. The members showed their cartoon characters tackling different environmental issues such as noise pollution etc. in their various manifestations on charts.

Project files with relevant background information and cartoon sketches were also made very creatively by each house. The members also satisfactorily answered the queries raised by the judges, ranging from the choice of cartoon characters to the material used.

- *Let's Talk Books -- the Inter-House Book Discussion Competition* was organised on 23rd October by the Sr Sec Dept. The books selected for discussion were E M Foster's 'A Passage to India' and Rabindranath Tagore's 'Home and the World.' The participants used evocative PowerPoint presentations and powerful oratory to analyse the plot, historical background, characters, themes, symbols and motifs that enrich the narrative of the two novels. The presentations were assessed on the basis of content, quality and co-ordination.
- The Middle Department organized *Inter-House PowerPoint Presentation and Folder Making Competition* on 1st February, 2011.

Ms. Deepika Kumar, Zonal Head of Academic Support Group and In-charge, Partner Schools in Delhi, Educomp was the Chief Guest. The students

presented their PowerPoints and folders on renowned scientists such as Albert Einstein, Stephen Hawkins, C.V. Raman, Jagdish Chandra Bose and other luminaries. The competition enabled the participants to do in-depth research work and equipped them with valuable information about the eminent global personalities.

GLOBAL SCHOOLS PARTNERSHIP PROGRAM (GSP)

The School achieved yet another milestone in its constant endeavor to add global perspective to education and activities at the school, when it became partners with Cwrt Sart Community School, Wales, UK under the Global Schools Partnership Program, which is an initiative of the British Council, India. Beginning with the Commonwealth Games that were held in India this year, the students of both the partner schools shall be undertaking collaborative projects aimed at enhancing awareness and promoting the Commonwealth Games, scheduled to be held in Glasgow, Scotland in 2014. The following activities have been undertaken so far:

- *Newsletters* were prepared by class X students on the various aspects of Commonwealth Games, such as, History of CWG, Mascots of CWG, CWG 2010 etc. The wide array of beautifully illustrated, colourful and informative projects was an expression of our students' sheer enthusiasm, talent and hard work. Approximately 20 of the selected Newsletters were subsequently scanned and mailed to the partner school. We have also received the soft and hard copies of the newsletters prepared by students of Cwrt Sart Community School.
- Another activity that enhanced our young learners' knowledge of CWG was the '*Captivating Commonwealth Games: News Reading and Reporting Competition*', organized by the Middle Department on November 1. A group of four students from each of the 8 teams prepared news clippings on the sporting events of CWG such as Badminton, Cycling etc. The eloquent News Reading and impressive Reporting was supported by well-researched and painstakingly prepared PowerPoint presentations by the participants. Ms Kanta Wadehra, a member of British Council and an active member of GSP who graced the occasion as Chief Guest was full of appreciation for this brilliant show.

- Through *Exchange of e-mails* between the two partner schools an attempt was made to bridge geographical distances. About 10 students of Cwrt Sart Community Comprehensive School e-mailed friendly introductory letters focusing on their festivals, food habits, important places etc. Our students too, responded to these communications and enlightened their counterparts regarding India's culture and traditions.

OUR CLUBS WITH AN INTERNATIONAL DIMENSION:

D 2 D – Delhi to Durban Club

D 2 D, i.e. Delhi to Durban Club was formed as a part of global partnership to promote cultural exchange between our students and CPSS, South Africa. The Club continues to fulfill its objective through a number of activities.

- In a very creative manner, regular games such as, Chinese Checker, Snakes and Ladder and Business were prepared and played on the basis of information relating to South Asia - its culture, geography etc.
- The D2D members also prepared PowerPoint presentation on various aspects of South Africa - its history, culture comparison of Indian and S. African leaders etc.

These activities helped to enhance the members' knowledge of their global partner country.

IAYP Club

The International Award for Young People, a self development programme commenced in our school from the year 2010. The programme equips the members with life skills, builds their confidence and engages them with their communities. The Award Programme comprises of four sections: Service, Adventure, Skill and Recreation. There are three Award Levels- Bronze, Silver and Gold.

In April, 55 students were recruited in the first batch. For the Adventure Section, various activities were organized for the club members at Ramjas Sports Complex.

Thirteen of these members were accredited with the Bronze Medal. Six of them are at present, working diligently and meticulously recording their efforts in various sections, in order to compete for the silver medal. Meanwhile, 36 students have been freshly inducted into this program in November, 2010.

Children for International Community Club

An Inter House PowerPoint Presentation was organized by the Club on 22 September on the theme 'Life of a Sports person'. The Guest of Honor was a veteran swimming champion and Arjuna Awardee, Mr. Bhanu Sachdeva. The painstakingly prepared impressive presentations focusing on the life and achievements of some eminent players, who had participated in the Commonwealth Games, such as Anna Rice, Abhinav Bindra etc. were highly appreciated by the audience.

INTERNATIONAL VISIT AND EXCHANGE PROGRAMMES

Visits and Exchange Programmes between the staff and students of different countries is a mutually enriching experience. They not only give a first hand experience of the culture and ethos of the country, but also the educational practices being followed. The exchange of ideas that ensues, surely proves to be beneficial for all concerned.

Principal's visit to Australia

The Principal, Sh L V Sehgal was selected to visit Australia to attend the Melbourne-Delhi Principals Programme. The programme aimed to:-

- a) Showcase Melbourne to Delhi Principals.
- b) Enhance Principals' knowledge and understanding of the Australian & Victorian Education System, school leadership and school management.
- c) Foster Principals' links with key leadership organizations and colleague Principals from Melbourne and to provide an impetus to the ongoing networking and exchange & support development and collaboration between the Melbourne and Delhi Principals, teachers and students.

During the visit, our Principal had a chance to visit Alkira Secondary College, a school set up in private-public partnership. It is a unique school, which follows Open Learning Classroom System. The school has shown interest in establishing friendship and collaboration with our school to promote mutual understanding and cultural awareness between Australian & Indian students.

Welcoming Mrs. Virginia Pavlovich, Principal Main Arm School, NSW, Australia

Under the Melbourne-Delhi Principals' Programme, Ms. Virginia Pavlovich Principal, Main Arm School from Australia visited Delhi from 8 January to 20 January 2011 to gain a first hand experience of the Indian way of life and in particular, the educational system. She observed the functioning of a typical Indian family during her stay with the Vice Principal, Mrs. Geeta Gangwani. At the Pusa Road unit, she observed the functioning of the Montessori system and the primary classes. At the Ganga Ram Campus, Ms. Pavlovich evinced great interest in language teaching and the use of the smart class in the teaching of English, Science and Maths. The assessment of students on the lines of the Continuous & Comprehensive Evaluation was an area of interest for our guest. The school tour, that included all our activity rooms, impressed her greatly. The local sight seeing trips to Dilli Haat, Kingdom of Dreams and the emporia etc. were all eye openers.

Ms. Pavlovich, shared information regarding the Australian educational system and way of life with the students and staff members. The Visit certainly established bonds of friendship and enhanced global understanding.

Visit to Germany

Five students and the German Teacher, Ms Sabina Chowdhary visited Germany from 6 June to 26 June 2010 under the Pasch Project, Sonnenberg 2010. The programme included 60 students from six different countries. Our School had the privilege of sending maximum number of participants for this programme. It was an excellent opportunity to know Germany, its culture, traditions and people. The group visited cities like Wolfburg, Wernigerode, St. Andreasberg, Göttingen. They also got an opportunity to meet the Mayor of St. Andreasberg, Hans Günter Schärf.

Principal's Visit to Colombo

Principal, Mr L V Sehgal, attended Principals' Conference at Colombo, Sri Lanka from 21st to 24th January 2011. The Conference where Principals of seven South East Asian countries were present, was arranged by the Goethe-Institut, Max Muller Bhavan, New Delhi. The Conference presented an overview of various projects that the initiative "Schools: Partners for the Future" will be offering in the coming year. An insight into the programme, which our school and students can take up, was also provided. The conference offered an opportunity for net-working with Principals of Schools from other countries.

BAL BHARATI MAKES ITS PRESENCE FELT AT INTERNATIONAL INTER-SCHOOL EVENTS

QUANTA

The 16th Annual International Competition for computers, science, mathematics and astronomy, QUANTA- was organized by City Montessori School, Lucknow, from 9 to 12 November. Teams from more than 50 countries participated in the event.

Bal Bharati has been a part of Quanta for almost a decade now. Our students proved their mettle yet again by bagging prizes in a number of events. Pranay Handa and Akshay Kumar Gupta from class X won the third prize in the event, Aqua Challenge, a boat race. Prashansa Taneja of class XI got the second prize in the Debate Competition. Divyanshu Bansal and Prakhar Kumar of class XII got the honourable mention in the Mathematics Quiz. Divyanshu Bansal, also got the honourable mention in the Mental Ability Test.

Geofest

Our school participated in Geofest, an International Interschool Competition organized by City Montessori School, Lucknow. The programme comprised of a variety of competitions like Cartoon Making, Model Making, Best out of Waste, Collage making, Quiz and a Group dance depicting the beauty of Nature. Our publications, Sagarika, the school magazine and the on-line newsletter, Sagarika provide a platform for our learners to showcase their creative abilities and get a brief

exposure to these tools of mass communication in this media barraged world of ours.

The online newsletter, Sagarika was posted at the website, [www. papyrusclubs.com](http://www.papyrusclubs.com), every month with contributions - illustrations, articles etc., from all departments on selected themes. It also helped us to provide a regular update to our audience regarding the happenings at the school.

Each department- Montessori, Primary, Middle and Sr. Secondary released their annual magazine, Sagarika in March 2011. Each one of these magazines was a beautifully presented confluence of ideas, views, school events & achievements that took place round the academic year 2010-11.

PTA ACTIVITIES

The Parent Teacher Association of the school is an active body that consistently enriches the school programs through its constant support in varied ways.

- The PTA organizes a Summer Camp during the Summer Vacation. It consists of a myriad of activities such as English Conversation, Vedic Maths etc.
- For different co-curricular activities, such as Judo, Skating & Aerobics, Coaches are provided by the PTA.
- On Children's Day, the PTA conducts a Painting Competition for the junior school students. The meritorious students are richly rewarded.
- The staff members who complete 25 years of service in school, are felicitated by the PTA on Teacher's Day.
- Students excelling in sports, academics and other activities are duly honoured by the PTA.
- The PTA organizes a get together for the staff members annually.
- During the Annual Winter Carnival, the PTA organizes the Antakshri Program.

TOURS & EXCURSIONS

We live in an enchanting world-full of beauty, charm and adventure. Travel provides us with immeasurable opportunities to enhance, enrich and expand our lives. The magical moments spent traveling surely have an everlasting impact on us. Each journey that we undertake is a learning experience. As we encounter, a myriad of cultures and form friendships, we stretch our limits beyond the known boundaries to the unknown.

Tours and excursions form an essential part of our curriculum, for we firmly agree with St. Augustine's view, "The world is a book, and those who do not travel, read only a page."

During the academic session 2010-11, students of Primary and Middle Department were taken in groups of 40 to Bal Bharati Activity Centre at Solan. They stayed there for 3 days and 2 nights and enjoyed the various adventure activities.

The outstation trips also included other destinations like Agra; Chandigarh and Chattbir Lion Safari; Nainital & Ranikhet; Sikkim; and Bangalore, Mysore & Ooty.

In addition, visits to Metrology Department, Old Age Home, Railway Museum, National Science Centre, Bal Bhavan, Zoo, Children's Park, World of Wonder, Adventure Island, Akshardham, Talkatora Garden, Millennium Park and Kutub Minar were also organized for different classes.

INNOVATIONS AND IMPROVEMENTS

The Hon'ble Chairman of the school, Sh. K.K. Khullar has outlined the motto for us to follow. It is:

To strive for

- Better & Better
- Service
- Solutions not excuses

This motto is the guiding principle in all our endeavors. Therefore, as we pursue our mission to provide quality education, we constantly strive to improve and introduce

innovations in our existing system, such as providing better infrastructure, adopting new teaching methodologies or updating the existing facilities etc. Bal Bharati, thus, is constantly evolving...

Some of the significant innovations and improvements made during the academic session are:

- Safety of children is our priority. An effort has been made to systematize the Dispersal of the students in a more efficient manner. Escorted by the respective subject teachers, the students exit from their building through the designated gates/staircases. The Bus-users move to the P.T ground to join their bus lines for attendance etc. and then board their buses under the supervision of bus incharges. On the other hand, the non Bus-users leave the school premises in a systematic single row. The Dispersal is being supervised very closely.
- We believe in giving individual attention to our learners. While we try to identify and develop their hidden potential, we also make efforts to identify and cater to students with special needs.

The school has, therefore, appointed two Special Educators – Ms Kirti Juneja for Pusa Road campus and Ms Surbhi for the Primary Department at Ganga Ram unit. In addition, Ms Anjali Kaushik has been appointed as the Counselor to provide guidance and counseling to students in different areas, including career opportunities etc.

- Young minds are very impressionable. The foundations for a healthy life style must be laid early in life. Therefore, a 'Fruit and Nut Break' has been made a part of the daily schedule for students of class IV & V. The 'Fruit Break' that was already being observed for students at Pusa Road campus has also been transformed into 'Fruit and Nut Break'. The students are also motivated to do stretching exercises.
- We live in a technology driven world. It has greatly benefited the classroom teaching too. The server for Educomp Smart Class was updated at Pusa Road

unit. Login ID for teachers and students were created and passwords were given to them. This online service can now be used more actively. Curriculum related presentations etc. can now be accessed from home as well.

Another initiative in this direction is the school's tie up with Everonn, the largest VSAT education network in the world. Everonn pioneers satellite based education through VSAT enabled virtual and interactive classrooms. It offers highest quality content to students through prescheduled lessons which are delivered through video conferencing. Everonn lessons were held in the month of May for students of Middle Department.

- The Mathematics and Science Olympiad were being conducted from Class III onwards. In order to develop a scientific temperament and nurture talent, they have now been introduced for students of class II, as well.
- Using SMS and E-mails, we are now able to reach out to the parents in a faster and more effective manner. Regular updates regarding holidays, Parent Teacher Meetings etc. are being regularly communicated. Important information can also be accessed on the school website. Assignments/Worksheets etc are also uploaded periodically.
- We have made efforts to implement CCE in its true spirits, as per the guidelines issued by the CBSE. Each child is to be assessed in co-scholastic areas as well. To execute the same systematically, in a uniform and fair manner, for each skill, five to seven parameters have been decided to enable the teacher to assess the performance of the students. A computer software has also been created for the printing of proformas. The computerized report cards of the students, giving the descriptive indicators of the learners in the required co-scholastic areas are being generated.
- Laboratories are essential for the effective teaching of science.

During this academic session, the laboratory for Biology, Sr. Physics and Jr. Computer were renovated completely. New apparatus and equipment, such as

Portable Projector Screen, and SMS connectivity etc. in computer lab, Micro kits in chemistry lab etc. have been introduced.

An in-house Library for reference purpose has also been set up in each Sr. Laboratory.

- Teachers constitute the foundations of the process of education. Professional enrichment and teacher empowerment are therefore, essential. Regular class supervisions of the staff members at BBPS, GR are done in a cordial atmosphere. Principal/Vice Principal/HM accompanied by an experienced subject teacher and at least one junior teacher of the department, as an observer, visit the class room. The idea is to gain from the teaching methodology, experience and expertise of each other. This also serves to enhance faculty interaction leading to academic excellence.
- At the outset of the academic session, the school's 'Table Calendar cum Planner' was brought out. In addition to providing an easy and systematic reference to the activities scheduled during each month, the calendar enabled us to showcase our students' artistic capabilities in an innovative manner. Their drawings/paintings have been used as illustrations for each calendar month, in this publication.
- Teachers' Handbook was published and distributed to the staff members. It contains useful information regarding school activities, rules and regulations, application forms for leaves etc.
- To add colour to our surroundings and make them more lively, a vibrant and colourful mural measuring 39'×9' was painted by the students, on a section of the boundary wall between Janaki Devi Mahavidyalaya and the school, adjoining the concrete area that faces the central lawn.

The DELF exam assesses the performance of students at six levels ranging from A1 to C2. 10 students got a Certificate of Merit each for A1 level, 2 students got the Certificate of Merit each, for A2 level and one student got Certificate of Merit for B1 level.
- '2010 Global Human Rights Protection Award' was conferred upon Mr L V Sehgal, Principal on the occasion of the 11th World Human Rights Congress held on 10 December 2010 at India International Centre, New Delhi.
- Mr L V Sehgal, Principal was presented the 'Indian Award for School Environment Management' by Global Open University, Nagaland for outstanding contribution in the areas of environmental education planning, school management and administration in the year 2009-2010.
